

Registration ■ CLEP examinations are administered by appointment only. Examinees must be registered St. Ambrose students. Call 563/333-6126 to schedule a time to take a test. Information about preparation materials is available from the CLEP website at www.collegeboard.com/clep

Test Fees ■ \$70.00 (per exam) check, money order or credit card payable to College Level Examination Program (CLEP).
\$15.00 (service fee per exam) check, money order or cash payable to St. Ambrose University.

Score Receipt and Transcribing ■ The CLEP exam is now given on the computer so you will receive your test scores immediately following your exam (two to six weeks through the mail for English Composition with Essay exam). The Registrar's office will inform you how your score rated based on St. Ambrose's CLEP equivalency grid and the number of credit hours available to you.

- If you scored the minimum score or above, you may pay a \$20 transcribing fee per credit hour for credits you wish to have recorded on your SAU transcript. We will tell you how to go about doing this in our score-reporting letter.
- If your score was below the minimum requirement, you may retake the test in six months.
